I, Patrol Officer Nicholas V D'Alessio, voluntarily, without threats or promises, make the following statements:

Narrative:

On 06/26/17, at approximately 0141 hours, I was on routine patrol in marked cruiser 304. While patrolling the area of Hamlet Ave, I observed a adult male operating a small, white, children's bicycle with pink hand grips and pink tires. The operator of the bicycle veered into the lane of travel on several occasions. I made contact with the operator on Hamlet Ave near the intersection of Welles Street. Officer Bourgoin also responded.

The operator of the bicycle was identified as Jeffrey Beaudreault. As I exited my vehicle Jeffrey let out a large sigh and stated that his vehicle was just towed by another Officer and borrowed his friends bicycle to ride home. Jeffrey stated that he spoke to his friend and allowed Jeffrey to take his daughter's bicycle to ride. When asked where his friend lived, Jeffrey pointed down the road to Hamlet Ave. I asked Jeffrey to confirm that he received consent to take the bicycle and Jeffrey stated that he did not ask to use the bicycle but knew that he would let him. While conversing with Jeffrey, he was swaying back and forth and making abrupt movements with his hands. On several occasions, Jeffrey was asked to keep his hands out of his pockets after thrusting them into them.

At this time I detained Jeffrey in handcuffs and conducted a pat down for weapons with negative results. Jeffrey was read his Miranda Rights, when asked if he understood his rights Jeffrey stated that he did understand. I asked Jeffrey again where he got the bicycle and he stated that after his vehicle was towed, he was walking on Hamlet Ave and took the bicycle from Hamlet Ave to ride home. He insisted that the bicycle belonged to his friends daughter. Jeffrey did not know the daughters name. He stated again that he would have let him use the bicycle but took it without asking.

Officer Bourgoin responded to Hamlet Ave in attempt to make contact with the owner of the bike. Officer Bourgoin made contact with a resident on the second floor. He observed that his Granddaughter's bicycle was missing from the common doorway. He described the bicycle a white children's bicycle with pink tires. This matched the description of the bicycle on scene. Officer Bourgoin transported him to my location where he positively identified the bicycle that Jeffrey was operating as his Granddaughter's bicycle.

I completed a property receipt that he signed and the bicycle was released to him. He also provided a written witness statement in which he stated that he wishes to file a formal complaint. Jeffrey was then placed in custody. I transported Jeffrey to the Woonsocket Police Department where he was processed and placed in a cell. During processing, Jeffrey repeatedly stated "come on man, I was just trying to get home".
